TOWN OF LONG BEACH SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING Via ZOOM THURSDAY, APRIL 22, 2021 11:00 AM

Participating and / or viewing this Zoom meeting were all five council members, Lemay, Johnstone, McFadden, J. Wall, and Kocher; town attorney Chris Willoughby, C-T de Funiak, Marilyn Jones & Assoc. with court reporter Lempa, Chief Swistek, Larry Wall-building commissioner along with other viewers totaling 33 + online today.

After the pledge of allegiance attorney Willoughby updated all present of the building commission special meeting and recommended the council table the topics discussed at that meeting. John Wall motioned to table the Voortmann & Stop 29 discussion; seconded by Lemay. 5-0 approval.

NEW BUSINESS:

2021 Salaries were tabled until the April 26th special council meeting by motion from Lemay and second by Johnstone; all approved.

McFadden updated the council of a resident with back charges due for refuse and suggested the council support the water department in collecting from this resident as the county collects on back taxes and that is to go back only the last three years. Lemay motioned for collection of the last 3 years refuse, Kocher seconded the motion; all approved.

The 4th of July plans were discussed in length by all involved and afterwards it was decided to table until the April 26th special council meeting at which time the Park Board and Long Beach Civic Association will have had collective information between the two parties to bring back to council.

Chief Swistek is requesting \$1,500 - \$2000 for his "Community Outreach" to the young people in Long Beach. He would like to purchase sunglasses, badges, footballs, beach items, etc. with a Park Board donation to the police. De Funiak stated there would be over \$2,000 from the recent sale of the defunct squad car. Joy Schmitt said the Park Board could use advertising funds for the purchase. It was suggested by McFadden that this subject be tabled until the April 26th special council meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Seth McCormick asked what really happened at the building department meeting held yesterday and asked for transparency.

Attorney Willoughby reminded council of no Q & A in the public comment portion of the meeting.
